The program will be presented by Chapter member Dave Morrison, a retired LIRR Branch Line Manager who managed the stations on the Port Jeff Branch from 1990 to 1999. Dave has conducted numerous "LIRR Historic Stations Tours" under the auspices of the NY Transit Museum. He is the author of 4 railroad books, including two Arcadia Publishing Company books - "Long Island Rail Road Stations" and "Jamaica Station."

Dave will discuss the history of railroad stations from Hicksville to Port Jefferson and on out to Wading River. He will use historical photographs as well as photographs that he took while he was in charge of the Port Jeff Branch.

List Happenings...continued by Steve Quigley

My wife and I were recently in Poughkeepsie NY visiting my son at the college he is attending there. We had some free time so we took a walk across the Hudson River. No, we did not walk on the water; we walked on the "Walkway over the Hudson." This bridge, which is 1.28 miles long, was originally the New Haven RR Bridge built between the years 1886 to 1889. In 1974, a portion of the bridge burned and was never used as a railway bridge again. A few years ago, an organization was founded to restore the bridge and use it as walkway. The bridge reopened on October 3, 2009 and the result is a pathway across the Hudson River that is 212 feet above the water in the center and has a magnificent view of both shorelines as well as the River. On the East side, Amtrak trains to and from Toronto, Albany and GCT travel, while on the Westside, Northbound and Southbound CSX freight trains are frequently seen. Metro-North train service originates about 1/3 mile south of the bridge and ends at Grand Central Terminal. If you are anywhere near the bridge, take advantage of the magnificent view that it affords. While we were on the bridge, a wedding ceremony complete with a full wedding party took place officiated by a judge. An interesting sight 200+ feet above the Hudson!

LIRR Happenings

The new Barclay's Center opened in Brooklyn on Sept. 28th. It is located across the street from the LIRR's Atlantic Terminal. The Center, which is the new home of the Brooklyn Nets, houses the first Pro Team to be located in Brooklyn since the Dodgers left for LA in the 1950's. This arena is built over the LIRR's VD Yard which Chapter members and guests toured back in 2007 on the Farewell to the M-1's Fan trip. Extra train service is being offered from Atlantic Terminal on the days of events.

Newsday, the LI paper, recently had an article regarding fencing along the LIRR right of way. The LIRR is doubling the budget for barrier fencing but the cost to fence all 670 miles of track is not feasible so fencing has been and will be concentrated in key areas. 4.8 miles of fencing has been installed since 2010. Special fencing which is difficult to climb or cut is now being used as opposed to chain link fence which we all used to climb.

In last month's edition of the Semaphore, we mistakenly noted that I took a tour of the East Side Access Project which when completed, will allow LIRR trains to enter Grand Central Terminal. Chapter member Dave Morrison was actually the person who took the tour. My apologies to Dave on this error.

THE LIRR MODELER...by Mike Boland

This Month's Feature:

Walthers PRR/LIRR Interlocking Tower...Part 2

Last time we began a new series of articles on Long Island ail Road interlocking towers that can be modeled by utilizing the recently-released Walthers PRR/LIRR Interlocking Tower kit in plastic. It is #933-2982 and is available in HO scale. So let's take a look at the LIRR's brick towers—both those in use currently and those towers that have been demolished—and see how we can model them.

Here we go; we'll study those brick towers that have been demolished first.Park Tower...an interesting tower that once stood between the mainline and the Hempstead Branch just east of Floral Park station when it and the surrounding trackage was on the ground. Once known as FK Tower, it was located on the ground as were all the LIRR tracks nearby—east of Light House Road, later named Tulip Avenue, and just east of where the Hempstead Branch veers away from the mainline. This brick tower was one of several that had a bay window on *both* sides of the tower that faced two sets of double-tracks. Both the mainline and the Hempstead Branch were later elevated in a major grade-crossing elimination project and Park Tower was razed. With a little work, this tower can be modeled with the Walthers kit.

Fremont Tower...we believe this tower was named after a nearby street named Fremont. This was a very interesting tower that our own beloved Harold Fagerberg worked before it was closed; it was razed many years later, we believe. (It was the only opportunity that Harold had to work on Long

Island, where he lived.) The tower was located in the upper yard at Fresh Pond on the New York Connecting Railroad where LIRR and New Haven/Penn Central/ConRail trains operated on the LIRR Bay Ridge Branch as well as the New York Connecting Railway over Hellgate Bridge.
